Context

This workshop followed the unveiling of <u>Con-textualizando la memoria /</u> <u>Contextualising memory outcome banner</u> and was part of the overall event <u>Con-textualising Memory / Con-textualizando la memoria</u> which included an online seminar "Sharing experiences of memory (Recognition) and truth in post-conflict times: Colombia and Northern Ireland".

Workshop participants had previously participated in a series of <u>three</u> <u>online workshops</u> in September 2021 which culminated in the creation of the outcome banner.

The purpose of this workshop was to give a deeper understanding of:

- The Conflict Textiles collection and the process of documenting/curating new pieces
- The arpillera movement in Chile and the techniques and process used
- The process of planning and designing arpilleras.

It also provided a space to make an arpillera doll that reflected participants' contribution to International Human Rights day 2021 in Ulster University, Magee Campus.
